PGL#204 - What is the Path?

"Let us first state what it is not. It is not psychotherapy, although aspects of this pathwork must, perforce, deal with areas which psychotherapy also deals with. But I might say that in the framework of the path, this psychological approach is only a side issue, a getting through of obstructions, so to speak. Dealing with confusions, inner misconceptions, misunderstandings, destructive attitudes, alienating defenses, negative emotions, paralyzed feelings is essential and this psychotherapy also attempts to do. However, while this is the ultimate goal of psychotherapy, the Pathwork enters its most important phase only after this stage is over, and that most important phase is, briefly, the learning of how to activate the greater consciousness dwelling within every human soul."

LETTER FROM PHILADELPHIA PATHWORK REGION'S

Dear Fellow Pathworkers, Most of us have been reading the many theories of what the year 2012 will bring. It is said to be the end of the Mayan calendar and could mean the end of the world - or just the end of the world as we know it. The readings differ but the common thread is that it is the ushering in of major energy shifts that have already begun.

I don't know what changes will manifest in regard to our planet, but if the changes we are experiencing in the Philadelphia Pathwork Region are any indication we can anticipate the future with joyous optimism.

Are you aware of what is happening in this region? First and foremost our region in the last ten years has been growing by leaps and bounds. We have

gone from a few trained helpers who worked independently with little or no structure each "doing her own thing," to a region that:

- Is incorporated and has by-laws and a tax exempt status.

the Helpers in their endeavors to spread the Guide's teaching and wisdom into new areas.

- Has offerings of First Fridays and First Wednesdays in nine locations in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. Two areas that have experienced an explosive expansion are in Hamilton, NJ and Pittsburgh, PA. Our two Helpers-in-Training, Pam Jones and Sue Van Doeren have approximately 30 people attending these events monthly!
- A wildly successful weekend workshop was facilitated by Carolyn Tilove and Sue Van Doeren in Pittsburgh and there are more events being planned. (How exciting is that?)
- Holds CCC day (Commitment, Celebration and Community). This year, TP-5 will graduate along with the Helpers-in-Training.
- We now have a weekly Pathwork quote being sent to our emails to inspire us daily.
- Our website is in the process of being updated and made more user-friendly.
- We are assembling a new Philadelphia Pathwork Directory.
- We have seven students who will be graduating in June from the Helpership Training Program. As they feel called by God, in their own rhythm, they will claim Helpership. That service may take many forms
